FULL OR PARTIAL FEE WAIVER FOR NATURALIZATION

PUBLIC BENEFIT RECIPIENTS

If you receive any of the following public benefits, we will help you prepare a fee waiver request at our event:

- SSI
- Medicaid
- All Essential Plans
- SNAP (food stamps)
- Cash Assistance
- Section 8 or Public Housing (Housing Choice Voucher Program)

What to bring to the event:

Bring a copy of the award letter from the state or federal agency granting you the benefit. (For example, SSI award or budget letter). The letter must:

- Be in English
- Be on agency letterhead
- Be dated within the past six months
- Clearly list your name as one of the persons receiving the benefit and the last date you were approved to receive the benefit

How to get your award letter:

- For SSI Award letter, call 800-772-1213
- For Medicaid (Proof of Medicaid Letter for Immigration), call 888-692-6116 (Monday - Friday, 9 am to 5 pm)
- For Essential Plan 1 and 2, call 855-355-5777
- For SNAP (budget letter) or Cash Assistance, call 718-722-8009. You will need your case number and ZIP code
- For Section 8 or Public Housing, call 718-707-7771

OTHER LOW-INCOME APPLICANTS

If you don't receive public benefits, but you have low income, we will assess your eligibility for a fee waiver at the event. You may qualify for a fee waiver if:

- Your household income is at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines at the time you are filing, or
- You have a financial hardship situation that you want USCIS to consider.
